Mrs. Johnson:

Capt. Sheppard came and talked to me about the facilities of Camp David. He said he would like to talk with you at your convenience about particulars regarding you all visiting there.

By helicopter - 30-35 minutes By car - 1 hour and a half - 1:45

Main House - Presidential bedroom - 2 three-quarter beds
Mrs. J's adjoining - 1 three-quarter bed
2 twin bedrooms --- all have private baths
The dining room seats 10-12 and extra people can
be served in the lounge (approx 20 in all)

Cabins
Witch Hazel - 2 double bedrooms
Dog Wood - 1 double bedroom
Maple - 1 double & 1 single bedroom
(All bedrooms have private baths)

There are separate accommodations for the stewards. There is a cabin with double bed which could be used for Helen and Gene.

One-fourth mile away is Staff area. It has a large house with a kitchen, however it is not decorated as nicely. Some of the curtains, slipcovers, etc. are not the best. Little by little, Capt. Sheppard has been having it painted and fixed up. It can accommodate 4 people.

The swimming pool, when frozen over in the winter, is used for ice skating. The tennis courts and golf course are closed now. There is some snow now and sleds, etc are available.

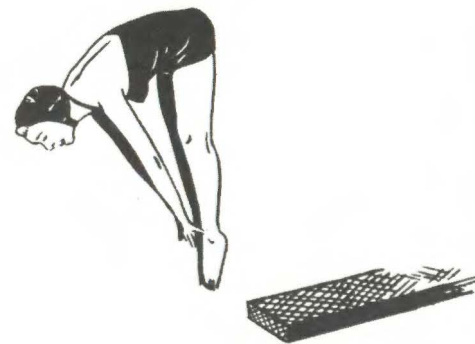


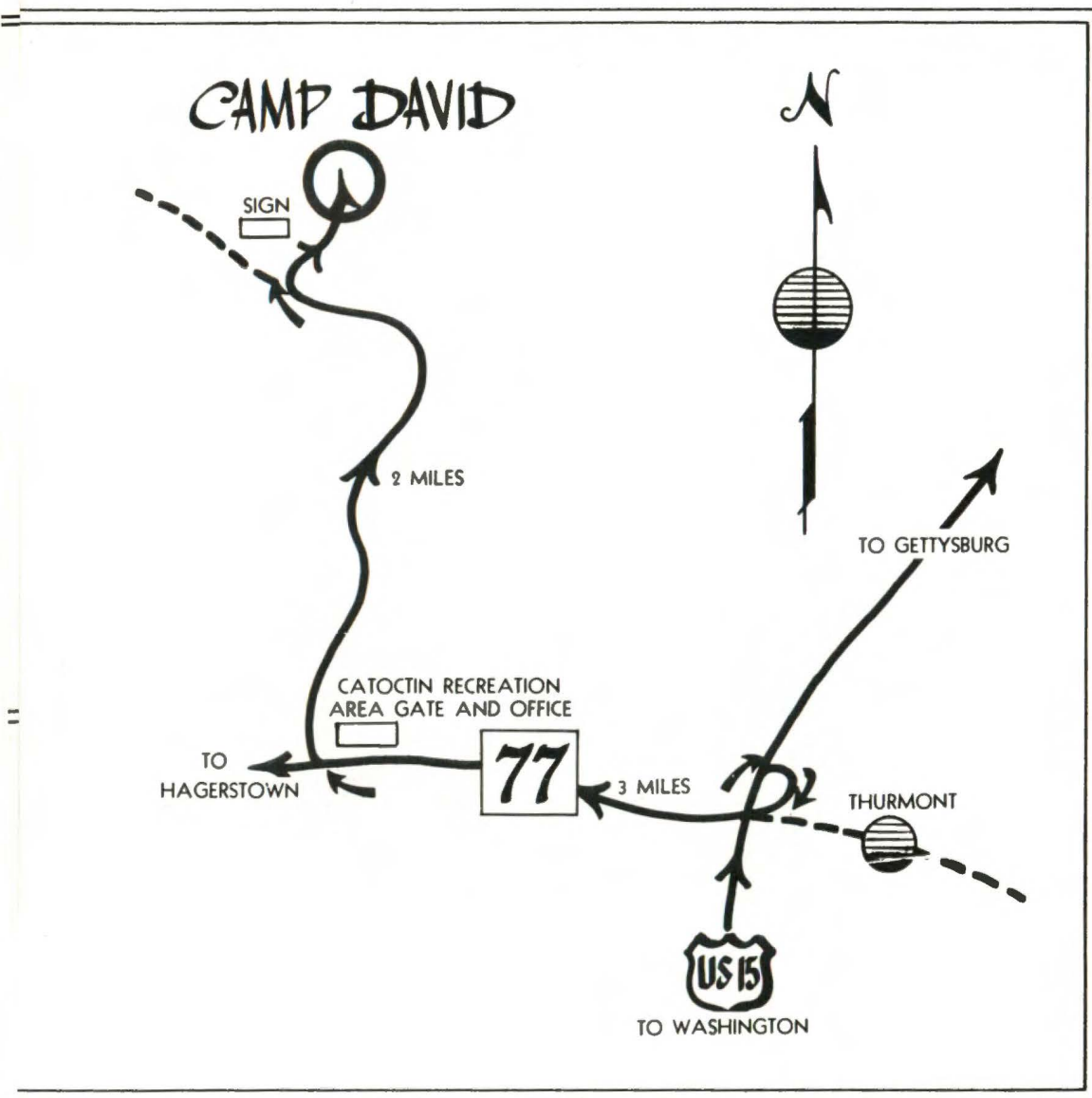
Camp David is the President's Mountain Retreat. It is located in the Catoctin Mountain Park, approximately 65 miles north of Washington, D.C. The maps on the following pages show the location and layout of the camp.

Sycamore, Hawthorne, Walnut, and Laurel cabins, which are located in the White House Staff area, provide sleeping accommodations for a maximum of thirteen guests. Central dining and lounge facilities are available in Laurel cabin.

Recreation facilities within Camp David include swimming, archery, badminton, horseshoes, tennis, hiking, and playground equipment. Movies are shown daily in the camp recreation building, Hickory. They may be shown in Laurel upon request. Trout fishing can be done in the nearby streams of the Catoctin Mountain Park.

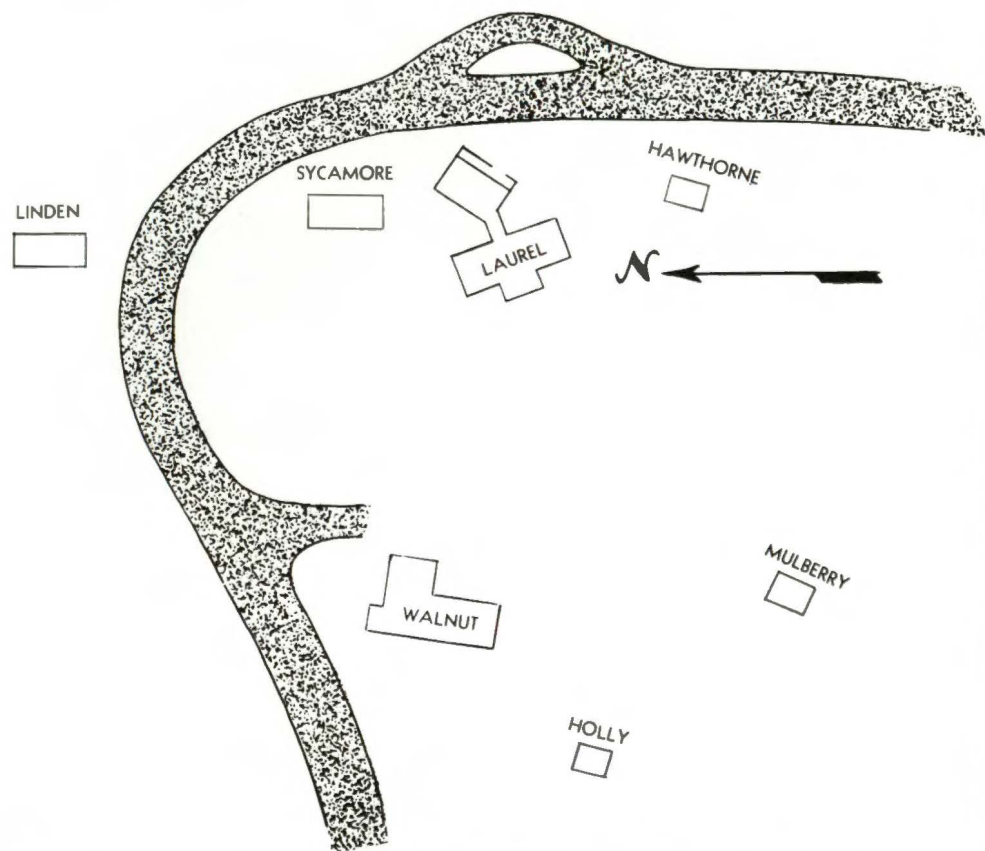
The camp is staffed by a detachment from the U.S. Naval Administrative Unit, Potomac River Naval Command. This detachment stands ready to provide as many services as possible. Charges for meals and refreshments are billed within ten days by the Mess Treasurer.



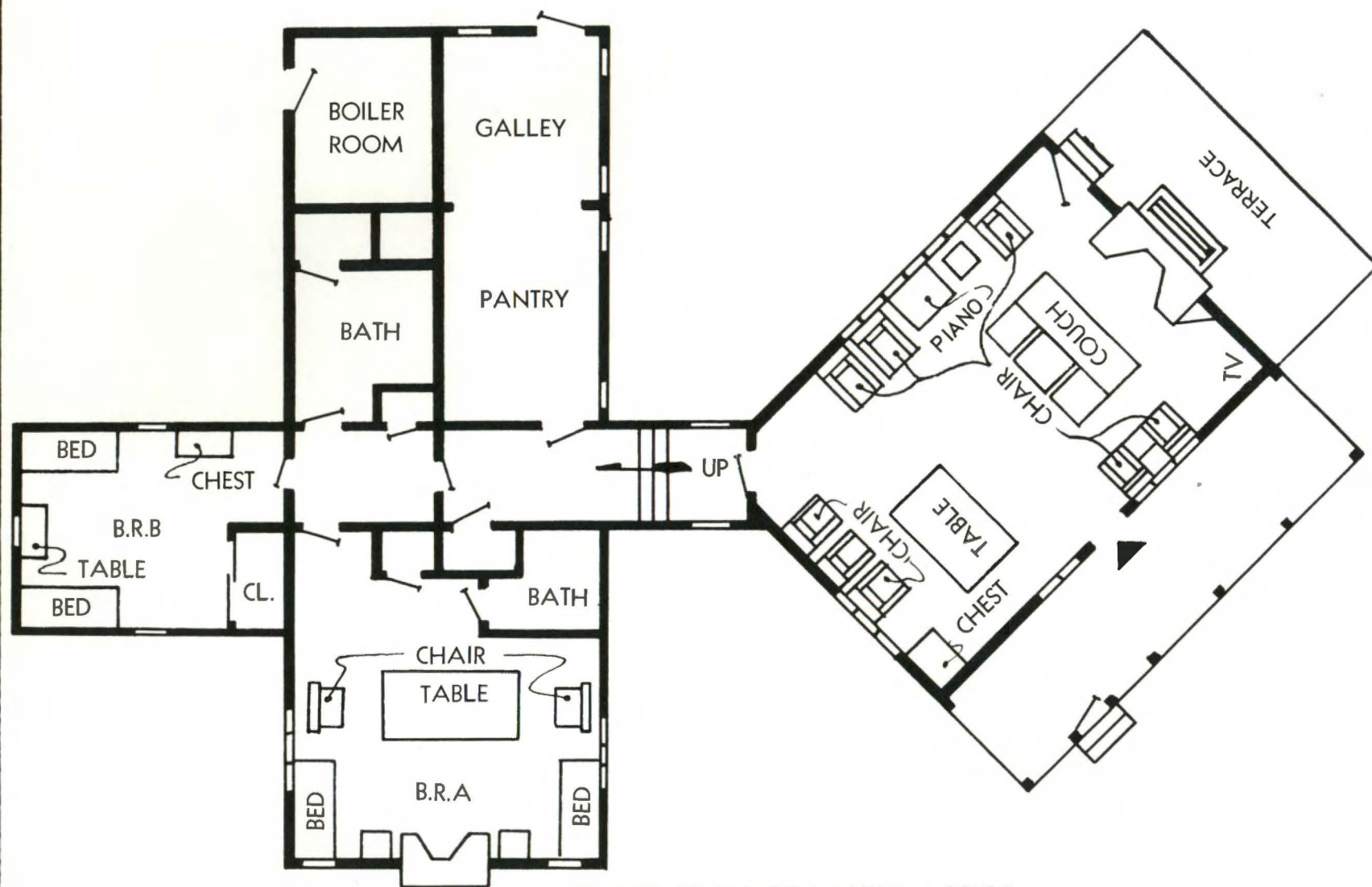


Map of the White House Staff area

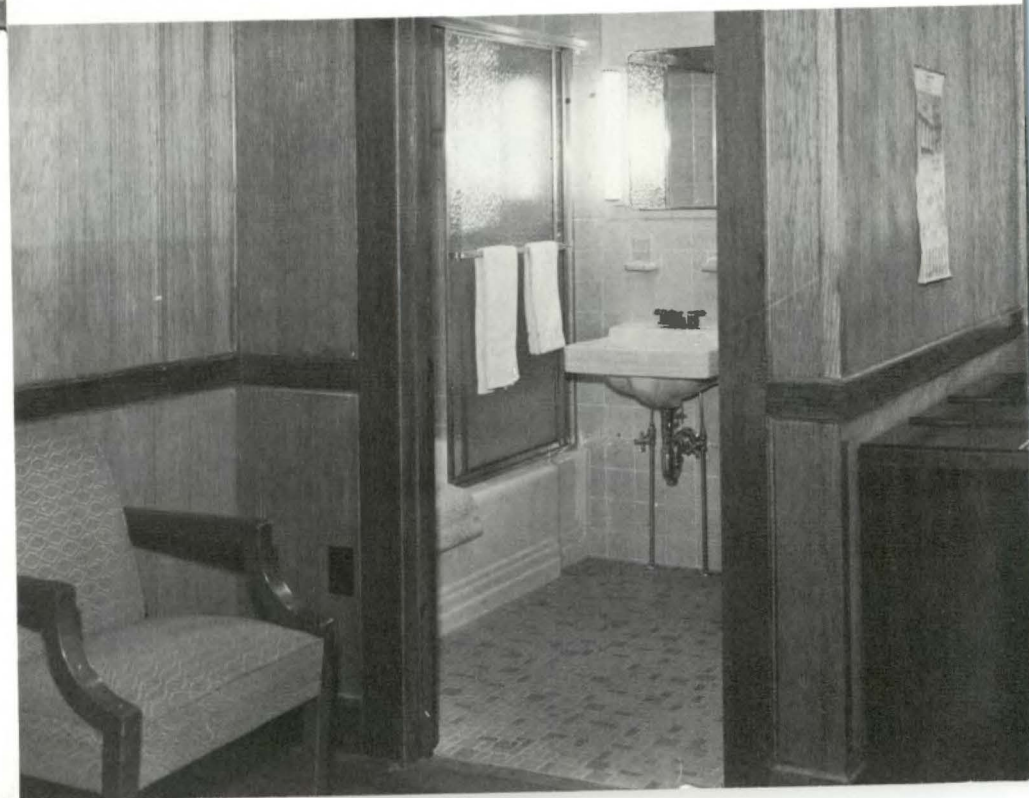

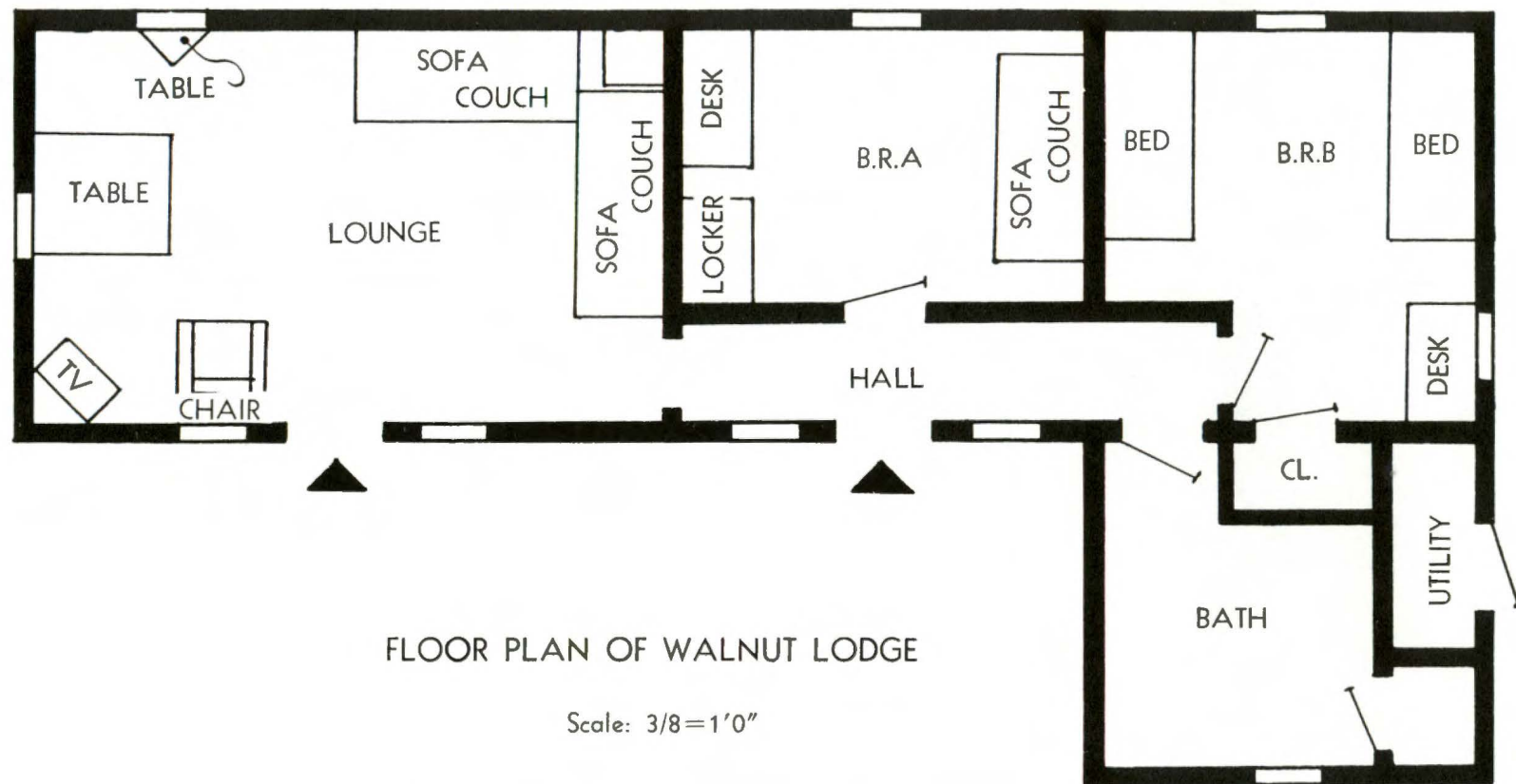

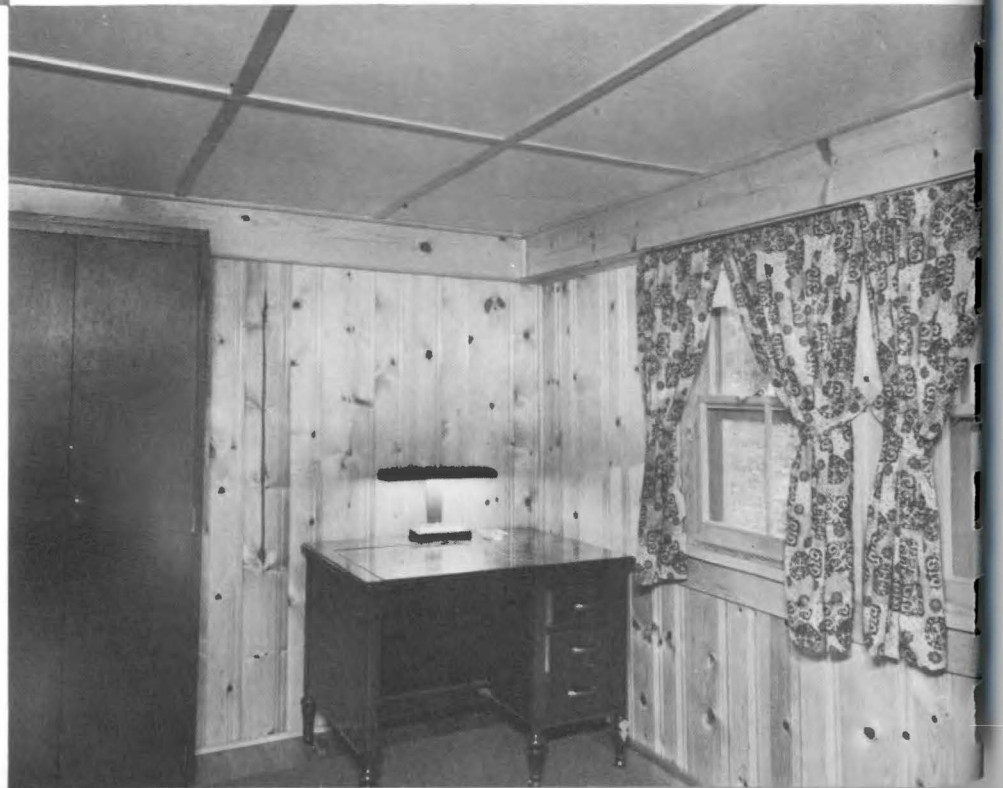

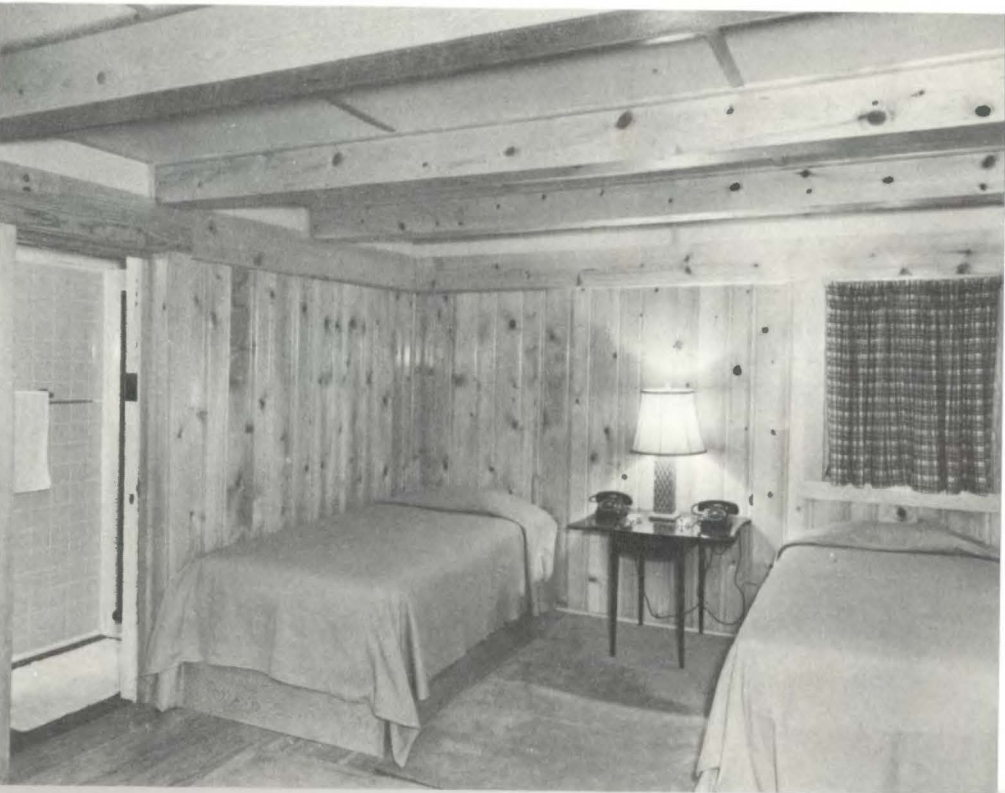

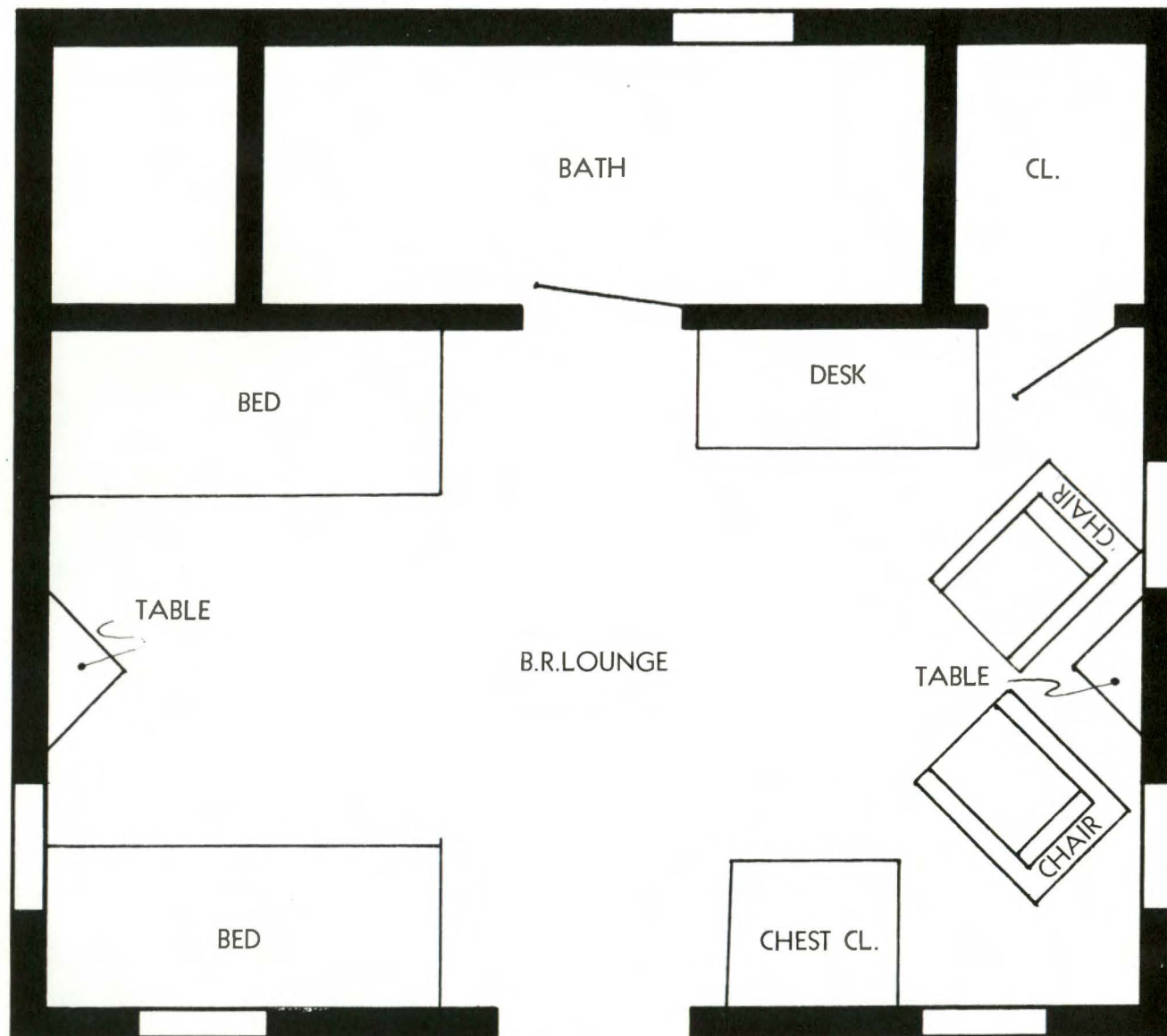
FLOOR PLAN OF

FLOOR PLAN OF



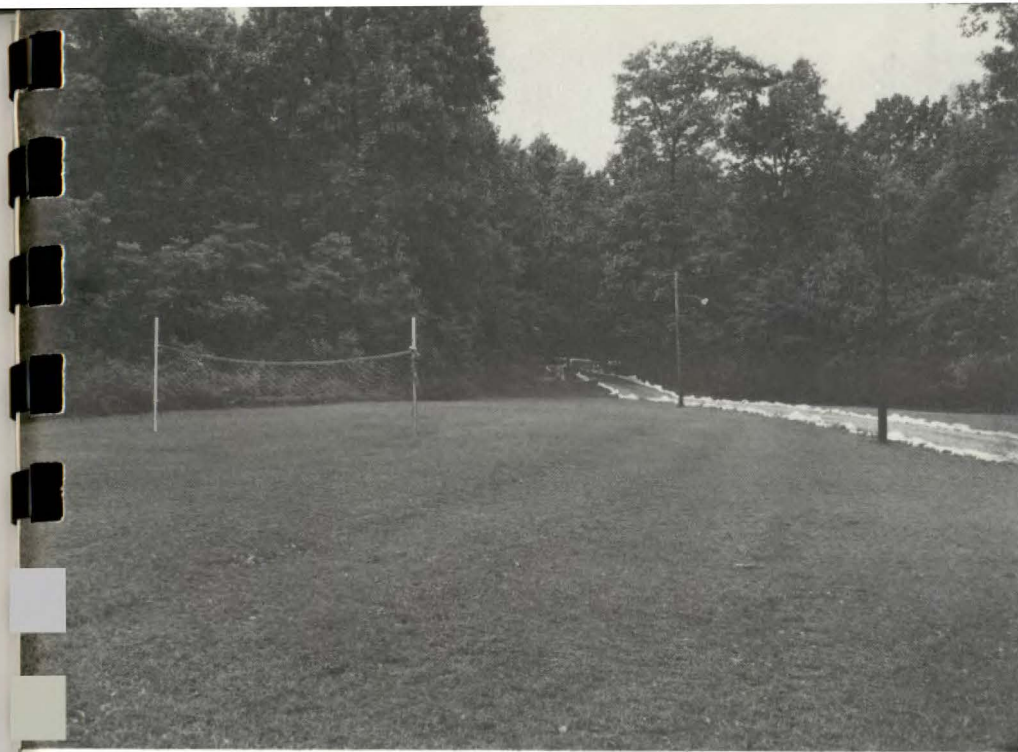
HAWTHORNE LODGE

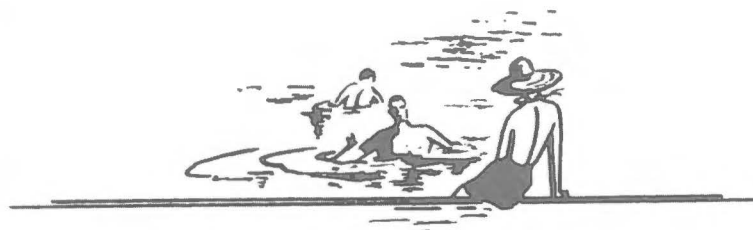
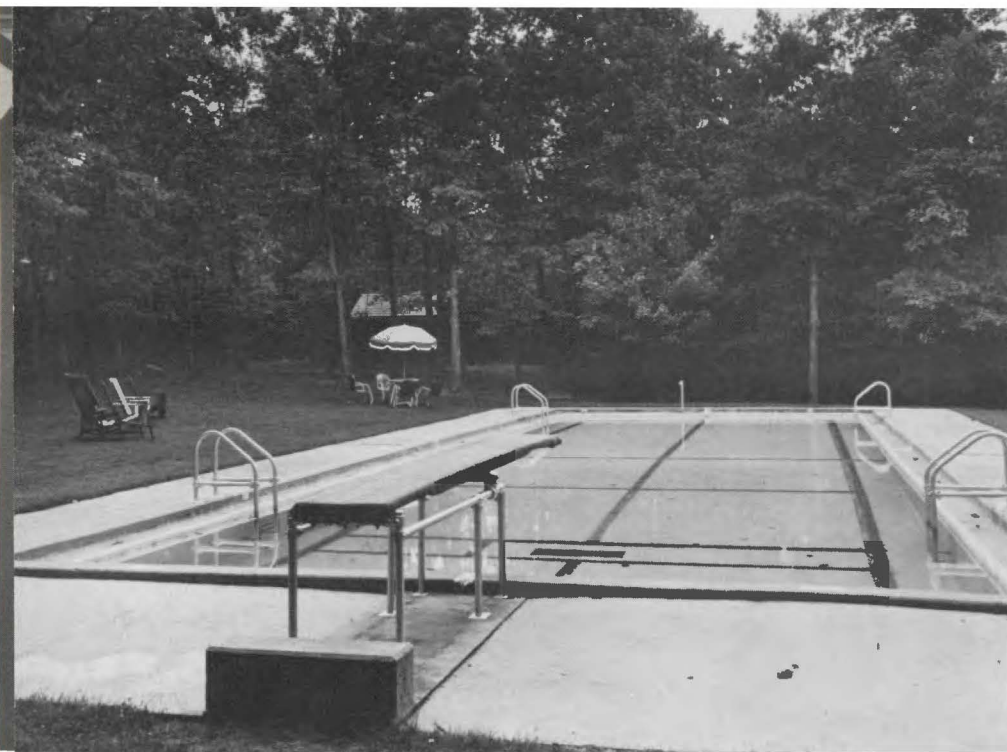




*Recreation area

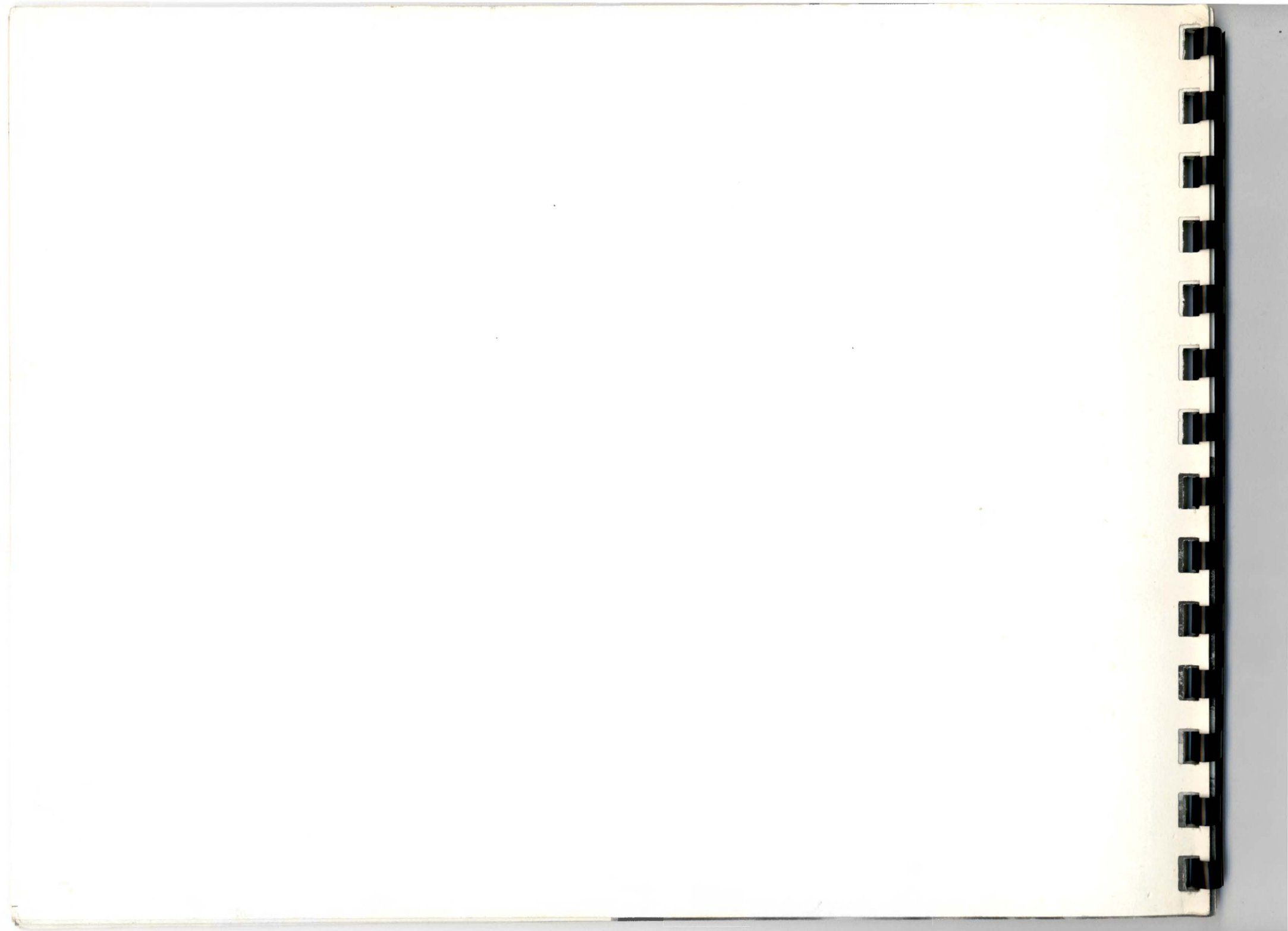

CAMP DAVID

Nestled in Catoctin Mountain Park in Frederick County, Maryland, is Camp David, a retreat for use by the President of the United States.

Officially a U.S. Navy installation, the facility was originally built by the Works Progress Administration as a camp for government employees, opening in 1938.

President Franklin D. Roosevelt took it over in a few years and named it "Shangri-La," for the mountain kingdom in *Lost Horizon*, the 1933 novel by James Hilton.

It was renamed in 1953 by President Dwight D. Eisenhower in honor of his then-five-year-old grandson, Dwight David Eisenhower II.

Over the years, Roosevelt's successors and their families have used it for a variety of reasons. Some spent weekends there relaxing with their families and special guests. Others have used it to study, write, or confer with top advisers. A few have used it to conduct global diplomacy and forge historic peace agreements.

Not far from Washington, D.C., and Baltimore and Frederick, Maryland, Camp David is also a short drive from Gettysburg, Pennsylvania. It is not open or accessible to the public, and a high level of security is maintained. The photographs reproduced in these pages all come from the holdings of the presidential libraries, administered by the National Archives and Records Administration.

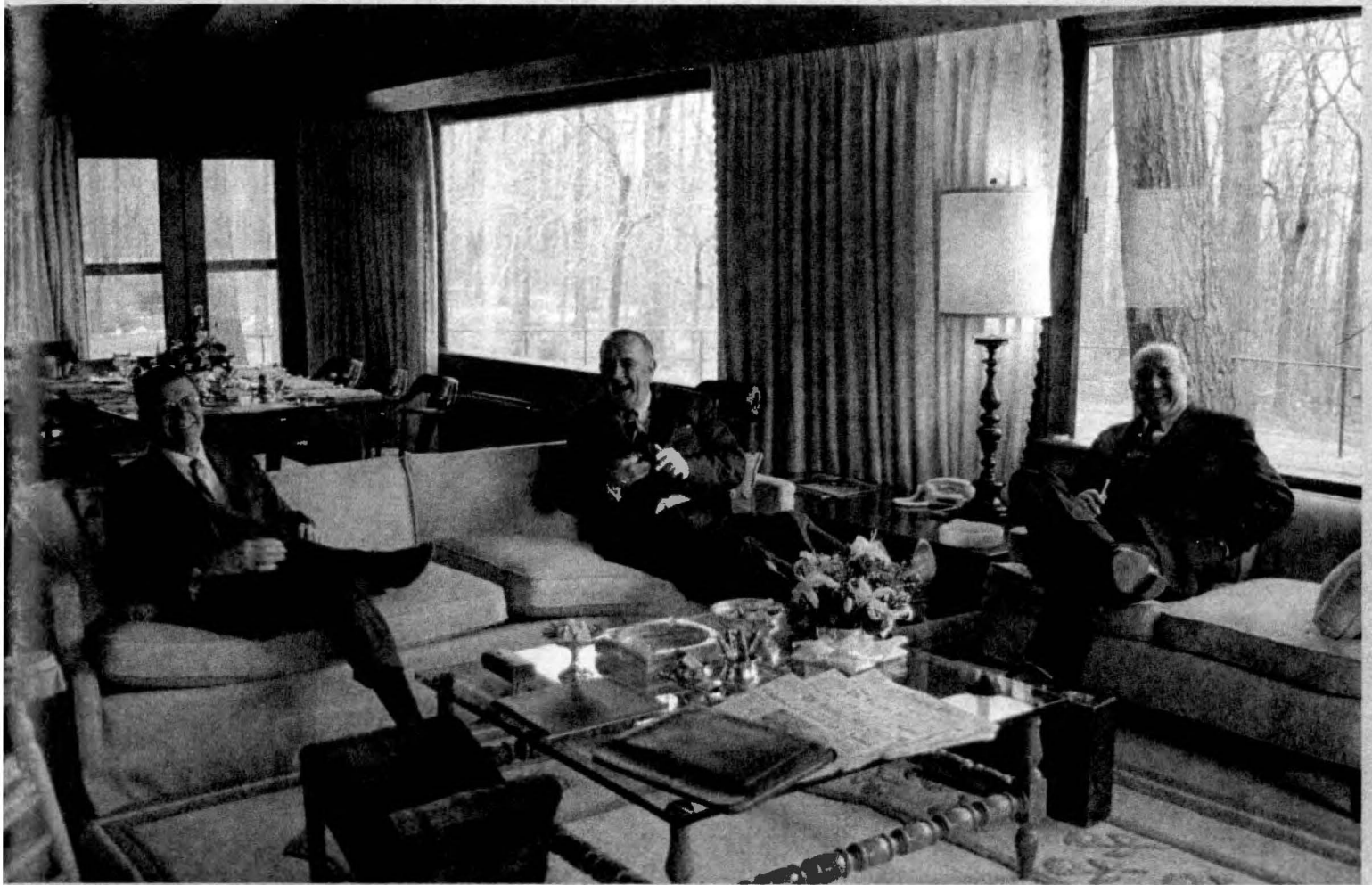

Dear Congressman Rumsfeld:

I have been asked to reply to your recent letter concerning a constituent who inquires as to who is paying for the President's trips to his ranch.

While the government pays for these trips, I think it is essential to recognize that when the President travels to any location it is a movement of the Presidency, and not just the individual occupying the office of the President. By the very nature of this office, it is necessary to move several other people including communications, transportation, and protective personnel. President Johnson, being acutely aware of the costs involved in all movements of this sort, takes as few trips as possible and on those rare occasions when he does visit his home in Texas, he uses the same aircraft on which he travels to carry these support personnel. This means, of course, that it is not necessary to have a support aircraft to carry support personnel, as has been the case in every previous administration. Per diem costs never change -- thus the costs would be the same even if the President were to visit Camp David instead of his ranch in Texas.

President Johnson, as all Presidents before him, must, because of the pressures of his office, take some time to relax in a surrounding which is restful to him. In the case of President Johnson, this is his home in Texas. President Kennedy traveled to Hyannis Port and to Florida and President Eisenhower visited Gettysburg and Augusta, Georgia, on many occasions during their tenures as President. In addition, all three have used Camp David near Washington, D. C. In reality, it is simply an opportunity to work in a more relaxed atmosphere. The President has made only seven short visits to his home this year -- I am sure that you will agree that this is precious little relaxation for a person under the pressures of being Chief Executive.

I hope that I have been of some help in answering your constituent, and I trust that you will understand that every effort is made to reduce the cost of all trips.

THE JOHNSON ADMINISTRATION

President Lyndon Baines Johnson first visited Camp David as Vice President. After he assumed the office of the Presidency, one of his first visits to the Catoctin Area was to visit the first Job Corps Camp, just down the road from Camp David. After spending some time with the young men in the Camp, President Johnson met at Camp David for dinner with his foreign and military advisors. After the meal, the group flew back to Washington. President Johnson became a frequent guest after this first visit. He would come to Camp David to relax. He enjoyed movies, bowling, walking about the Camp or simply sitting on the patio and enjoying the view. When disturbed by the several demonstrations and other political disturbances of the day, President Johnson would climb into his helicopter and fly to Camp David for a "clearer view of national horizons".

The President's daughters, Lucy and Lynda, also enjoyed the Camp, entertaining their friends there on several occasions. Recreational items which appealed to them were movies, bowling, shooting skeet, and the swimming pool. Lynda Johnson would often drive to Harriet Chapel at Catoctin Furnace for church services. President Johnson continued the policy of holding church services at the Camp. On July 18, 1965, church services were held on board by Dr. Billy Graham, who was spending the weekend with President and Mrs. Johnson. As with the Kennedys, the Camp David crew and their families were invited to attend.

President Johnson also continued the policy of entertaining visiting Heads of State at Camp David. On July 22, 1967, Canadian Prime Minister Lester Pearson was a guest, and he and President Johnson held a joint press conference at the lower patio of Aspen Lodge. Over the weekend of June 17, 1967, President and Mrs. Johnson hosted Prime Minister and Mrs. Harold Holt of Australia. The weekend was originally scheduled for the Johnsons' Texas ranch, but at that time, Soviet Premier Alexei Kosygin was in New York and President Johnson wanted to stay close to Washington, should the opportunity for a meeting with the Premier arise. President Johnson explained the nature of the trip to the Maryland mountains by saying: "primarily we look forward to having a nice Saturday evening and Sunday with an old and treasured friend".

During the weekend, the two leaders toured the Camp on a golf cart and held numerous private discussions which covered such topics as the Middle East, Australia's role in the Vietnam war and other topics of the day. For entertainment Saturday night, the two showed each other home movies. On Sunday, both families, along with fifteen members of their parties, attended church services at Harriet Chapel at Catoctin Furnace. After the services, the President and the Prime Minister chatted with the congregation and played with the children present.

In April of 1965, when the Dominican Crisis broke out, President Johnson received his first news while at Camp David. He kept in close

contact by telephone to the White House Situation Room. On Sunday, April 25, the President invited his advisors to fly to Camp David for conferences, but because of the fog, helicopter operations were cancelled. President Johnson was driven to Thurmont where he boarded his helicopter for his return flight to Washington.

President Johnson on several occasions used Camp David for conferences with his highest advisors. In The Vantage Point, he described one such conference:

"After dinner we reviewed the progress of discussions on the nonproliferation treaty...the next morning, October 2, we continued our talks. Much of the time we wandered over the paths and through the autumn-colored woods at Camp David."

In April of 1968, shortly after President Johnson announced that he would not seek re-election and that he was seeking peace talks concerning the Vietnam war, he held a conference at Camp David. Those in attendance were Secretary of State Dean Rusk, Ambassador to Vietnam Ellsworth Bunker, Secretary of Defense Clark Clifford, Mr. Walt Rostow, Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff Earle G. Wheeler, Mr. MacGeorge Bundy, and Mr. Averall Harriman. Discussions concerned mainly the selection of and alternate possibilities for the talk sites. A press office was established in nearby Thurmont and all news items were released from that point. Again from The Vantage Point, Mr. Johnson described the conference:

"On the evening of April 8, I flew by helicopter to Camp David. It was a relief to get away from the noise and carbon monoxide of downtown Washington. At the Aspen Lodge I changed into more comfortable clothes and sat in the living room talking with Walt Rostow about the problems we would be discussing the next day. Finally, I dozed off in my chair until dinnertime. The next morning, I drove to the helicopter pad to greet my visitors from Washington...We went to the Lodge and over breakfast, talked about Vietnam and discussed the latest exchanges with Hanoi. We later moved outside to enjoy the sunshine and continue our discussions."

A History of Camp David





Probably the most useful file for you will be the President's Daily Diary. There is an index (Diary Cards) to the Daily Diary in the Reading Room. There are twenty-eight cards for Camp David. I have enclosed a sample page of Diary Cards and a list of all the dates for which we have cards on Camp David. The Daily Diary and the related President's Appointment File (Diary Back-up) should provide considerable information of interest to you.

The White House Central Files (WHCF), Subject File, categories WH 3 (Buildings and Grounds) and TR (Trips) contain information on Camp David. The WHCF, Name File, contains some letters and numerous cross-references to additional Subject File categories.

I have enclosed an excerpt from a Department of the Navy history of Camp David. Unfortunately, the excerpt is all I have been able to find. A bibliographic search turned up numerous titles relating to the Camp David Accords and one article in Reader's Digest by Peter Michelmores, "Camp David: Hideaway for Presidents" (#107, November 1975, pages 110-114).
