#### Scope and content note:

This collection consists of files that Bill Moyers created when he was associate director of the Peace Corps, 1961-1963, deputy director of the Peace Corps, 1963-1964, and special assistant to President Lyndon B. Johnson from 1964-1967. The files include materials related to the Peace Corps, the 1964 presidential campaign, legislative programs, the administration's public communications, relations with the press, domestic and foreign policy issues, economic issues, government organization, and government administration. The collection also contains materials related to Moyers' professional activities, duties, social activities, and accomplishments. The collection includes correspondence, memorandums, reports, speeches and drafts, opinion polls, press releases, telephone logs, bound volumes and other printed material.
