On a winter afternoon in 1964 at the LBJ Ranch, Secretary of Interior Stewart Udall and Mrs. Johnson discussed how to "strengthen the cause of conservation—a cause close to her heart." From this visit came the idea of forming a committee which would have as its goal the beautification of Washington, D.C. On February 11, 1965, the first meeting of the Committee for a More Beautiful Capital was held. The Committee was formed of philanthropists, designers, publishers, government officials, and civic leaders. The Beautification Files document the activities of this Committee, its fundraising arm called the Society for a More Beautiful National Capital, and beautification and conservation programs started throughout the nation.

Since so many different people were involved in this program, these records do not reflect the work of one or two people, but they do reflect the activities of Mary Lasker as President of the Society for a More Beautiful National Capital, Sharon Francis as staff assistant to Secretary Stewart Udall, Secretary Udall, and Liz Carpenter.
