Press on the trips is indicated by TR #/PR 18 [TR/Publicity]. This category includes material on press pool arrangements, charter aircraft assignments, credentials, press facilities, press kits and fact sheets, lists of press, press secretary's memoranda to the press, schedules,, costs to press, international press comments, press briefings, complaints from press re treatment, and press plane arrangements.
