So will all of us who believe that the women of this country have a place in public life and that in the annals of the Great Society, it will be recorded that women took on their responsibilities alongside men.

I am always pleased to see such a large turnout of women. I know that your presence means that you want to participate in the building of the Great Society. It will take many of us to provide the bricks and mortar for the better life for all our people that we seek.
