Audley Moore invited over to attend a planning board hearing Newark City Hall June 12, 1967. With instructions to create a disturbance at the meeting. She was invited by Col Massen of the Black Mans Army and George Richardson a known agitator.

Audley Moore attended the meeting and tried to upset it by yelling and interrupting the speakers, and insulting policeman, referring to negro police officers as Plaincloths Vermints and Uncle Toms. At the close of the meeting she seated her self in the Chairmans chair in the City Council seating. She left after sitting there about ten minutes she was completley ignobed by the police Department.

She is known to her followers as the Queen Mother.


Arrested in 1934 for inciting a riot in New York City. Sept 9,

SUBJECT: Public Hearing on proposed location of the New Jersey College  
of Medicine and Dentistry -- May 22, 1967 -- City Hall

The Newark Planning Board conducted the above hearing chaired by Alfred Booker, Executive Secretary to the Board. The meeting started at 8:00 p.m. and terminated 11:20 p.m.

It was a noisy, roudy meeting with boos and jeering from the audience and foot stomping, speakers being interrupted by individuals in the audience.

Three people were ejected from the meeting by the Police Department. One woman and two men, followed by the ejection of one more male.

Soon after the meeting opened, the woman, Ossie Bey of 379 Belmont Avenue, sitting in a second row seat, threw eggs at the Planning Board. No one was hit by the eggs. She was taken out of the room along with her husband, Clinton Hobson Bey, both taken outside of the City Hall and barred from the meeting. The Beys operate a restaurant at 106 So. Orange Avenue. Former residence Washington, D.C. and somewhere in Mississippi.

A self-styled Colonel representing a so called Black Mans Volunteer Army Hassan Jeru - alias - Tony Williams - alias - Albert Ray Osborne. A former resident of Washington, D.C. Former resident of L.A., California. Also claimed to of had a wig business in the Watts section of L.A.

Spoke and predicted violence in the City of Newark if the Medical Center is built or started. Hassan only a resident in Newark no more than two weeks stated he wants homes and schools built in the Central Ward Medical site. He was very militant and rude to the Board.

He finished, took his seat, and later in the meeting he seized the floor that was given to former Assemblyman George Richardson, who yielded the floor to Hassan. There was an exchange of words between the Chairman and Hassan. It was finally agreed to let him have the floor. He leaped up to the Council stand and ripped out the stenographers notes from the stenotype machine, kicking the speakers stand over and knocking over a map on the stand on the council podium.

Hassan was taken out of the hall by police and taken outside. Yelling "the whole world will see what you are doing to the Colonel, lock me up, I am destroying your records". Outside the City Hall he asked to be locked up. He was not arrested but told by police not to come back into the meeting.

Also ejected was one of his aides, a Captain Rafio. Both he and Colonel were wearing dark suits with an army khaki shirt and Black Beret with insignia on the shirts and beret, and a red artillery scarf. Also present was Lt. Balio, a Newark resident. This unit currently seeking information on him.

Following people spoke to the Planning Board:

1. Walter Dawkins, Director of Blazer, a Newark Poverty Program. He predicted civil disobedience in the City of Newark if plans for the Med School were not terminated. He stated the Newark Police will be useless if disorder comes to Newark.
2. Newark School Teacher Harry Wheeler stated the meeting was illegal. He stated the two principals involved in the Medical school had already negotiated for the land.
3. Director of the Newark Housing Authority, Louis Danzig, spoke and was subjected to booing and cat-calls.
4. Fire Director John Caufield read a report on danger of fires in the proposed site. He listed the fires that had already taken place in the area.



Robert Fullerlove S.N.C.C. organizer; Phil Hutchins, S.N.C.C. Organizer. Sandy Muszalski, Mary Ousley, Barbara Dunn...of 22 Rutgers Street, Vista Girls working in Newark.

A few people from the Bedford Stuyvesant section of Brooklyn.  
Earl Harris, former Freeholder of Newark, Essex County.  
Eulis Ward, Democratic Chairman of the Central Ward.  
Duke Moore, a postal worker; Henry Robinson, Sheriffs Jailer, Essex County.

Heckling from the rear of the room was Lester Coughlin, son of a former deceased special police officer.

The meeting was ended by the Chairman when it was out of control of the chair.

SUBJECT: "We Ain't Gonna Move" Rally, Held at the Black Liberation Center  
207 South Orange Avenue - May 21, D 67 at 2:00 P.M.

Sir:

I hereby report that I attended this meeting, and the following is a list of the speakers as they appeared.

1. Clint Hobson Bey, who from all indications is the head man of the Black Liberation Center. Mr. Bey and his wife Ossie were brought here by Mr. Derek Winins from Jackson, Miss. Mr. Winins met the two of them when he went to Jackson, Miss. to take food to the freedom fighters. Mr. Bey acted as narrator for the rally.
2. Mr. Bob Curvin, Newark Training Institute, Core. Mr. Curvin stated that the people in the proposed site of the Medical Center should not move and that all of the Negro population in this city should be called on to support these people.
3. A Minister from the Dutch Reform Church, who's name I was unable to get. I checked with Mr. John Barnes of the Human Rights Commission who was present at this meeting, but he failed to catch the name also, but told me that he would have it later today. This minister was very bitter, he stated that he had just come here from the state of Georgia and the Negro in Georgia was better off then the Negro in Newark. He also said it is only in the Negro Community that the schools have half sessions, and that the Negro in Newark should just stop letting their children attend school at all, schools where over half the children are Negro and no Negro History is taught. He further stated that he was ready to go into the street and die rather see his children forced to attend a school where the teachers are of inferior nature. *Rev West*
4. Mr. George Richardson, New Frontier Democrats. Mr. Richardson spoke of the power of the vote and the Negro's laxity as far as voter registration was concerned. He also told them if they expected to get anything for themselves they would have to take and give some physical beatings. He also stated that violence was the only thing that the power structure was afraid of, and that violence is what they were going to have to use.
5. Kenneth Gibson-Candidate for Mayor last city election. Mr. Gibson told them that he was with them but his job stopped him from being open with his participation. He also told them that he was the one responsible for them getting some of the first hand information that they had. He told them that they should attend all of the hearings on the Medical Center (public hearings) and voice their opinions, because everyone has to be heard at a

hearing of this nature, and all of these meetings are recorded and are read by the people in Washington, D.C. who will have to say if the money for this project should or should not be given. And if attending these meetings or hearings fail, this matter can be taken into a Court of Law. But the main thing was that we continue to fight it until our last hope is exhausted.

6. Eulis Ward, Central Ward Democratic Chairman. Spoke of unity and voter registration, and the rest of his comments were about the same as the speakers that preceded him.
7. Col. Hassan-Blackman's Army of Liberation, Washington, D.C. Col. Hassan told the people gathered there that you did not need a large amount of people to cause a demonstration, he demonstrated this by having the people yell no, louder and louder until the building shook with vibration, then he told them that this did not only work indoors, but that a small group of twenty six (26) men under a man named Castro went into the hills of Cuba and Batista the ruler at that time laughed, and at the final end, it was Castro who did all the laughing. He told them that a small group, those present, could start destroying the White Man's precious property and cause the White Man to want to stop and talk it over.

This was all of the speakers, but present in the center were the following: Robert Fullerlove and Phil Hutchins, the Newark organizers for the Student Non Violent Coordinating Committee (SNVCC).

Mrs. Boatright of 43 E. Kinney Street, whose son had an incident at Oliver Street School on May 8, 1967 which caused the demonstration on Friday, May 19, 1967 at the school -- she said a few words of thanks for their help in that matter.

Mr. Derek Winins, editor and owner of the Herald Advance, who just listened and took notes.

Mr. Stanley Winters, who was shown to me by Mr. John Barnes, who told me that Mr. Winters was very active in blocking a proposed project that was to be erected between Bergen and Belmont on the East and West, and Avon Avenue and 17th Avenue on the South and North. This office holds file on Mr. Winters. Attached find copy of throwaway listing persons and organizations.

All speakers call for a renewed effort on the part of everyone present to get as large a crowd out to the Public Hearing as possible Monday evening May 22, 1967.

It states : Attend the planning Board meeting in the City Hall June 12, 1967, Bring every member of your family and bring your lunch. We are fed up with tyrants who lie steal and cheat our people. Defeat the white race do not sit idly by while the city hall laugh.

SUMMARY:

A. Purpose: To ostensibly help American Negroes fight for freedom against white tyranny so they could emigrate and win citizenship in a new Africa. The organization advocates separation of the races with the aim of joining fellow Negroes in Africa. Volunteers for this army are to be taught Swahili and judo. Osborne's goal is to recruit 5000 followers, but according to available sources, the group appears to have about 12 activists.

B. Jail Periods:

1. Records of the Dist. of Columbia jail as of 14 Nov 66 reflected that Osborne served there from 26 August 1954 to 25 August 1956 for passing 21 worthless checks in Washington D.C.

2. He was sentenced in Pittsburgh, Penna., in 1957, to serve two and one-half years for forgery.

3. Osborne was committed for mental observation at Washinton D.C. from 27 Jan 1950 to Feb 11, 1950.

SUBJECT: Group Causing Trouble at Newark Planning Board Hearings

The files of this office contain the following information of the group causing trouble at the Newark Planning Board Hearings:

Members of the Newark Community Union Project, a community action project of the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) have become quite vocal in the South Ward area of Newark. It has been reported that the SDS will try to "keep the people in this area upset" on various racial issues.

Three SNCC workers operating out of the Black Liberation Center, 107 S. Orange Ave, Newark have recently begun working among Negroes in Newark's Central Ward. The three are Robert E. Fullilove, III, age 23; Clinton Hobson Beg, age 30, and Phillips Hutchings, age 25. Hutchings is further described as a one time college classmate of Stokley Carmichael.
