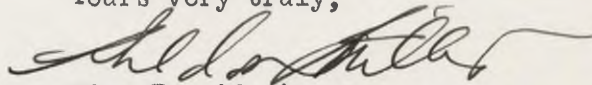
Dear Senator Johnson:

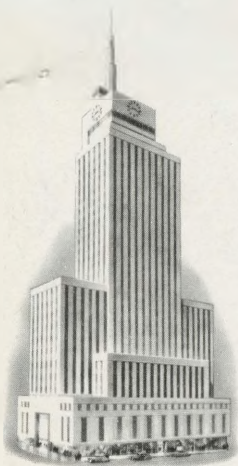

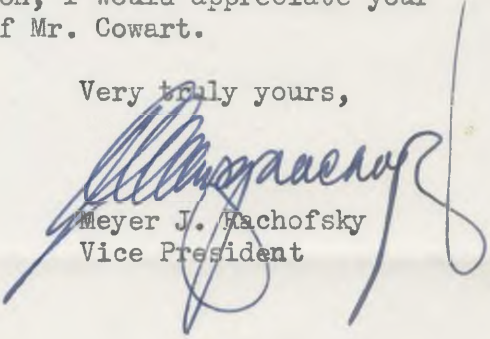

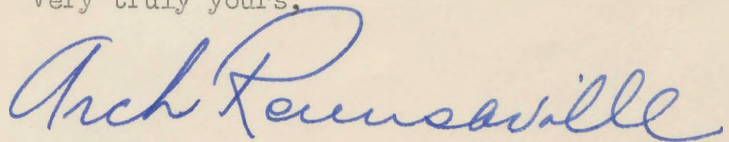
