TELEPHONE CONVERSATION BETWEEN CONGRESSMAN KILDAY AND
WALTER JENKINS

Congressman Kilday called and said as follows:

"I have talked with Owen about the matter we discussed and he has had a talk with Freddie Siman. Freddie says that he did not call Parr. He knows Carson and Carson may have done it. Carson is not an attorney although he has on occasions left that impression. Freddie suspects that Carson may have called Parr and he may have even said he was Freddie. If he did, it would be for the purpose of seeing what he could do to help himself, to see what he could get out of it.

"I asked Owen if he felt that Freddie was telling him the truth and he said yes he felt that he was. It looks as if Carson was trying to promote something. Freddie, of course, has reached the point where he doesn't have to solicit any business. Carson is not an attorney. Freddie said he would not think of calling Parr."
