Dear Mr. Wirtz:

The attached invoice from Merchants Printing Company covers material ordered for and shipped to the Austin headquarters. I have discussed this bill with Mr. Wortham today. Inasmuch as the supplier has been after us about the payment of this bill, Mr. Wortham has requested that I send it to you as he and Mr. George Brown have stated that they prefer to have this bill paid out of Austin.

Mr. Wortham has requested that I endeavor to budget the expenses of the Houston District headquarters, and stay within the budget which he and Mr. Brown have approved, and this item for Austin was not included in this budget.

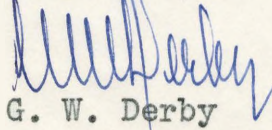

My dear John:

I want to recall that you ordered 150,000 R.E.A. folders on May 10th, and I placed the order with the Merchants Printing Company, Hermann Building, Houston, and, on May 12th, I billed you for 100,000. Before shipment was completed on the 100,000 order, you placed an order for an additional 150,000, making a total bill of \$684.27. This printing was placed on a cash order basis, and I personally guaranteed the bill so that delivery of the material would not be delayed.

On June 13, at the suggestion of the local finance committee, a letter was addressed to Mr. Alvin Wirtz regarding the payment of this bill through the Austin headquarters. 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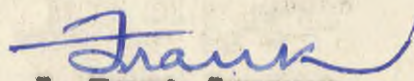
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
