Biographical sketch:

Silas Douglass Cater was a Washington editor for Reporter magazine from 1950 to 1963, and national affairs editor from 1963 to 1964. He was Special Assistant to the Secretary of the Army in 1951, and Special Assistant to President Lyndon B. Johnson from 1964 to 1968. Cater also served as a professor at several universities in the 1960s and 1970s.

Scope and content note:

This collection consists of correspondence, manuscripts, publications, scheduling materials, photographs, recordings, and mementoes collected by Douglass Cater covering his career as an author, journalist, consultant, educator, and Special Assistant to President Lyndon B. Johnson. Much of the material pertains to education and education reform, democracy, politics, the Vietnam conflict, and the career and impact of Lyndon B. Johnson and includes correspondence with Lyndon B. and Lady Bird Johnson.
